


FIGURE 2: ACTION TO REORGANIZE SCHOOL DISTRICTS – TEN PERCENT PETITION PROCESS




FIGURE 3: SUMMARY/COMPARISON CHART OF OPTIONS

| | Time Length | Result | Other Notes |

| Action to Reorganize Districts (new district formation) | Unknown/varies depending on waivers and whether state approval is required. Assuming there are no waivers and an election is required, <u>earliest possible</u> effective date is July 2013 (<u>not likely</u>). Would more likely be July 2015 or after. | Complete autonomy—new, independent school district formed. | New district formation has been quite rare. |
| Charter School Conversion | Approx. 90 days <u>after</u> submitting signed petition (assuming no appeal process). | Each school within the PLCS converts to a charter school. | Must be done on a school-by-school basis. |
| Instructional Autonomy Agreement | Unknown. Would require negotiations and approval by SDUSD board of ed. | Limited and temporary autonomy pursuant to agreed-upon terms of contract. | LJHS currently has an agreement in effect with SDUSD—given because of high API scores and renewal contingent on student performance. |
