## PLCS Meeting Minutes May 4, 2009

- 1. Innovative Multimedia LA Curiculum
  - Polly reported: Polly Traylor and Julie Cramer attended a meeting by Scholastic: Innovative Multimedia LA curriculum.
  - Geared for 6-12 graders.
  - Curriculum: Expert 21. Lessons are in Workshop formats. Uses Multimedia format. Multitier reading levels. Linked to career development. Workshops expose to career knowledge. Inquiry based. Several district reps also attended the meeting. SIOs and Carol Barry & Nellie Meyer have discussed this program as pilot at PLHS this summer. Not for sure...but probable. If successful...push into Correia and Dana.

## 2. .5 Principal Polly Traylor

- Confusion regarding the .5 principal issue. The issue is resolved and principals are restored to all schools. For sure it is restored to all magnets schools. Eddie Park indicated that it is at all schools. The bus transportation at magnet schools also restored.
- 3. Mandarin Chinese Program at Barnard Edward Park (Principal at Barnard)
  - 1st year in SD. 14 years in LA Unified. 1st experience in elementary school.
  - Came to Barnard specifically for Mandarin program.
  - Implemented Korean in LA. Very enthusiastic for Mandarin program.
  - 168 students at beginning of year at Barnard.
  - Marketing plan: Contact Chinese community leader in SD. Families with Children from China (mainly adopted children). Informed the Asian and Chinese community. Chinese community has taken up advocacy and promotion for Barnard. Korean community radio and news has advertised to 50,000 San Diegan Korean populations. Big marketing push. Language awareness is a priority for the school. Enrollment 250 confirmed for next year 09/10.
  - Typical day: 45 minutes foreign language: mandarin.
  - 5<sup>th</sup> grade added next year. 6<sup>th</sup> the following. The rationale is that the students will gain proficiency and continue to the language support.
  - Partner signing agreement with SDSU, Confucius Institute supports teacher training in Chinese. Working on proposal to get all teachers to visit china next year. Culminating trip next year for 5<sup>th</sup> grades: go to china all expenses paid. Sister schools in China. Han Ban Organization partnership with Barnard.
  - Assessment: haven't had a model in terms of assessment,. World language
    group from district is coming in to assess the program. This year is basically the
    implementation process. Kindergartners are progressing very quickly. Looking
    into an immersion program. Each child uses a mios (device). Next year 3-5<sup>th</sup>
    grades will have Lenovo laptop. Has all networking and processing capabilities.
    Goal: students will be globally ahead in all areas, particularly technology.
  - Official curriculum map provided to SDUSD.
